# NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

This report is submitted to the Administrative Procedures Committee and to the Administration Commission in compliance with the requirements of Section 120.70, Florida Statutes, which provides:

Not later than February 1 of each year, the division shall issue a written report to the Administrative Procedures Committee and the Administration Commission, including at least the following information:

- (1) A summary of the extent and effect of agencies' utilization of hearing officers, court reporters, and other personnel in proceedings under this act.
- (2) Recommendations for change or improvement in the Administrative Procedure Act or any agency's practice or policy with respect thereto.

#### GENERAL

Caseload of the Department of Management Services (DMS), which is comprised of the former Departments of General Services (DGS) and Administration (DOA), increased by 33 percent with a total of 256 DMS cases filed, up from the DOA-DGS combined 1991 agency total of 193 cases filed. Significant caseload increases for this Agency include the Human Relations

Commission's total which increased from 83 in 1991 to 147 in 1992, an increase of 77 percent.

The Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services' referral of child abuse cases steadily increased to 950 cases filed in 1992, up 27 percent from 750 cases filed in 1991.

The number of Exceptional Education cases filed also increased from 39 cases filed in 1991 to 45 cases filed in 1992, an increase of 15 percent. This 15 percent increase is also reflected in the 127 School Board cases filed in 1992, up from 110 cases filed in 1991.

Ethics Commission cases, which were newly tracked in 1991, increased to 24 cases filed in 1992, up from 21 cases in 1991, an increase of 14 percent for this agency.

In 1992 the Division entered into ten contracts with various governmental entities with 35 contract cases being filed during this past year. The contract cases have increased by 35 percent over the 26 contract cases filed in 1991.

Requests for Hearing Officer services in 1992 totaled 7,729, which is an eight percent decrease over 1991's grand total of 8,403 cases filed. Significant to this decrease is the number of Baker Act cases filed, which decreased from 3,648 filed in 1991 to 3,392 filed in 1992, a decrease of seven percent. Filing of Department of Corrections, prisoner Rule Challenges was eliminated during the latter part of 1992. In 1991 there were 64 Department of Corrections prisoner Rule Challenges cases filed; 50 were filed in 1992, a decrease of 22 percent. Cases filed under the newly formed Agency for Health Care Administration,

which includes the Health Care Cost Containment Board, Office of Licensure and Certification, and Certificate of Need cases, decreased eight percent, with a total of 316 cases filed in 1992, down from the 345 cases filed in 1991.

## UTILIZATION OF PERSONNEL

The Division has 62 established positions comprised of the Director, Assistant Director, 30 Hearing Officers, 1 Division Clerk, 1 Administrative Services Director, 1 Executive Assistant, 1 Accountant, 1 Purchasing Agent, 1 Personnel Officer, 3 Administrative Assistants, 1 Computer Programmer Analyst, 1 Computer Operator, 5 Staff Assistants, 11 Administrative Secretaries, 1 Senior Word Processing Systems Operator, and 2 Senior Clerks.

## WORKLOAD INCREASES

During calendar year 1992, the Division processed 7,729 hearing requests, a decrease of 674 cases (eight percent) from the 8,403 filed in 1991. The cases opened are itemized by agency in the attached Appendix 1.

Of the 7,729 cases, 3,392 were Baker Act cases. The remaining cases were filed pursuant to Section 120.54, 120.56, and 120.57, Florida Statutes. In 1992, each Hearing Officer handled an average of 162 new cases, conducted an average of 103 hearings, and wrote an average of 91 recommended or final orders of varying length and complexity.

In 1992, the Division held a total of 5,038 hearings, 239 hearings less than the 5,277 hearings held in 1991. During

the year, the Division closed 7,901 cases, an average of 161 closures per Hearing Officer.

## OFFICE AUTOMATION

The primary systems applications for the Division are office automation, a customized Case Tracking System (CTS), and a full text retrieval and indexing system for all recommended and final orders (ACCESS). Secondary applications include computerized Florida Statutes, electronic mail, and an automated desk calendar. During 1992, the Division continued to upgrade workstations by trading in older-style processors for 80286 or better workstations and by adding memory to all workstations. Additional disk space, memory and tape backup drives were added to the Division's shared resource processor, a Unisys XE530.

## OPERATING BUDGET

Appendix 2 summarizes the Division's actual and estimated expenditures for FY 1991-92 and FY 1992-93, respectively. Appendix 2 also outlines funds requested in the Division's FY 1993-94 Legislative Budget Request.

Since FY 1987-88, the Division has conducted studies to determine a more equitable method of apportioning its operating costs among all users. The Division is responsible for preparing annual reports which summarize the number of hours scheduled by agencies for prehearing conferences, motion hearings, cancelled/continued hearings, and final hearings.

In July, 1992, the Division submitted the results of its sixth annual study to the Legislature and Executive Office of

the Governor (see Appendix 3). In FY 1991-92, agencies scheduled a total of 31,056 hearing hours with the Division, an increase of 5.56 percent over 1990-91's 29,419 hearing hours scheduled. the 31,056 hours scheduled in FY 1991-92, the Division's Hearing Officers actually spent 9,028 hours in administrative proceedings, a decrease of 1.84 percent under the 9,197 hours expended in 1990-91. In FY 1991-92, 22,028 hearing hours scheduled were cancelled or continued, an increase of 8.93 percent over the 20,222 hours cancelled in 1990-91.

In FY 1992-93, the Division will receive 100 percent of its approved operating budget from the agencies it serves. It should be noted, however, that due to a lawsuit filed in early FY 1991-92 by school districts against the State Board of Education, the Legislature, and the Division challenging the constitutionality of the laws providing fund transfers from the school districts to the Division, the posture of the Division's Administrative Trust Fund is uncertain.

## RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE A.P.A.

The Division has no current recommendations concerning the Administrative Procedure Act.
