TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

This report is submitted to the Administrative Procedures Committee and to the Administration Commission in compliance with the requirements of Section 120.70, Florida Statutes, which provides:

Not later than February 1 of each year, the division shall issue a written report to the Administrative Procedures Committee and the Administration Commission, including at least the following information:

- (1) A summary of the extent and effect of agencies' utilization of hearing officers, court reporters, and other personnel in proceedings under this act.
- (2) Recommendations for change or improvement in the Administrative Procedure Act or any agency's practice or policy with respect thereto.

GENERAL

Fiscal year 1994-95 saw a significant increase in the hours of hearings scheduled and held by the Division in comparison to the previous fiscal year. In FY 1994-95, the Division scheduled 29,817 hours of hearing in comparison to 25,445 in fiscal year 1993-94, an increase of 17.18 percent

(Appendix 1). The actual hearing hours held also increased over FY 1993-94 by an average of 14.32 percent. At the same time, the number of cases actually going to hearing decreased by 5.40 percent. This indicates that the cases that are heard are becoming increasingly more complex and require significantly more time and resources to hear and decide.

The charts attached to this report (Appendix 4) break out by agency the utilization rates of Division resources and demonstrate that in descending order the Agency for Health Care Administration, Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services, Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Department of Community Affairs and Department of Insurance are the agencies that utilize close to 75 percent of the Division's docket. Additionally, the Water Management Districts have become a major user of the Division's services, although not reported on the State agency break outs since the Districts are charged an hourly rate by contract as opposed to the pro-rata division of hearing time allotted among other State agencies.

In 1995, a total of 64 Florida Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Act (NICA) cases were filed, up from 46 cases filed in 1994. These cases continue to require employees to devote a significant portion of their time to processing and appeals activities because of the significant amounts of dollars involved and the inordinate amount of filing and paper generated by these cases. Additionally, the caseload

increased by 177.78 percent with 25 cases referred by nine governmental entities compared to nine cases filed by four entities the previous year. Additionally, final authority rule challenge hearing requests increased by 35.48 percent, up 77 cases from 294 filed in 1996 compared with 217 cases filed in 1995.

UTILIZATION OF PERSONNEL

The Division has 66 established positions comprised of the Director and Chief Judge, Deputy Chief Judge, 30 Administrative Law Judges, 3 Court Reporters, 1 Budget Director, 1 Executive Assistant, 1 Personnel Officer, 1 Division Clerk, 1 Deputy Clerk, 3 Administrative Assistants, 1 Accountant, 1 Purchasing Agent, 1 Fiscal Assistant, 1 Distributed Computer Systems Analyst, 1 Office Automation Specialist, 1 Computer Operator, 4 Staff Assistants, 11 Administrative Secretaries, and 2 Senior Clerks.

In-House Court Reporters

Since FY 1994-95 the Division has employed three full time court reporters. The goal is for these reporters to cover 100 percent of the Division's hearings in Tallahassee. DOAH reporters covered 79 percent of Tallahassee hearings in FY 1995-96, up from 53 percent in FY 1994-95. The court reporters produced a total of 34,112 pages of transcription in FY 1995-96. This data was not capturable, however, for FY 1994-95, during the program's first year as a pilot project. See Appendix 3.

In 1995 the Division held a total of 4,018 hearings, 118 less than the 4,136 hearings held in 1994.

Although the overall case load decreased in 1995, the Division's overall productivity increased as evidenced by each Hearing Officer's ability to more timely bring cases to closure. The Division closed 7,105 cases, a +2 percent increase over the 6,949 cases closed in 1994. This is an average of 197 closures per Hearing Officer, as compared to 131 closures per Hearing Officer the previous year.

OFFICE AUTOMATION

The primary systems applications for the Division are its Case Tracking System (CTS), a full text retrieval and document indexing system for all DOAH recommended and final orders (ACCESS), and word processing. Secondary applications include electronic mail and computerized legal research (Florida Statutes, Florida Administrative Code, Southern Reporter and Federal Reporter). During 1995, the Division established realtime or computer generated court reporting in two of its hearing rooms in conjunction with its in-house court reporting program.

OPERATING BUDGET

Appendix 3 summarizes the Division's actual and estimated expenditures for FY 1994-95 and FY 1995-96, respectively. In FY 1995-96, the Division is 100 percent trust

funded and receives transfers from the agencies it serves. Appendix 3 also outlines funds requested in the Division's FY 1996-97 Legislative Budget Request.

Since FY 1987-88, the Division has conducted studies to determine a more equitable method of apportioning its operating costs among all users. The Division is responsible for preparing annual reports which summarize the number of hours scheduled by agencies for prehearing conferences, motion hearings, cancelled/continued hearings, and final hearings.

In August 1995, the Division submitted the results of its ninth annual study to the Legislature and Executive Office of the Governor (see Appendix 4). In FY 1994-95, agencies scheduled a total of 29,817 hearing hours with the Division. Of this total, the Division's Hearing Officers actually spent 7,578 hours in administrative proceedings. In FY 1994-95, 22,239 hearing hours scheduled were cancelled or continued.

It should be noted that the lawsuit filed on July 8, 1991, by five school districts against the State Board of Education, Legislature, and the Division challenging constitutionality of the laws providing fund transfers from the school districts to the Division, which was upheld by the circuit court, was appealed by the Division. On April 12, 1994, the First District Court of Appeal reversed the circuit judge's order of summary judgment and remanded with directions to enter summary judgment for DOAH. The Division continues to pursue collection of past-due payments for Hearing Officer services from school districts and other educational entities.

RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE A.P.A.

The Division has no current recommendations concerning the Administrative Procedure Act.
