TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

This report is submitted to the Administrative Procedures

Committee and to the Administration Commission in compliance with
the requirements of Section 120.65(10), Florida Statutes, which
provides:

Not later than February 1 of each year, the division shall issue a written report to the Administrative Procedures Committee and the Administration Commission, including at least the following information:

- (a) A summary of the extent and effect of agencies' utilization of administrative law judges, court reporters, and other personnel in proceedings under this chapter.
- (b) Recommendations for change or improvement in the Administrative Procedure Act or any agency's practice or policy with respect thereto.

GENERAL

Appendix 1 indicates that the Division scheduled 30,238 hours of hearing for state, local, and other agencies in FY 1997-98. This represents a 12.60 percent increase over the 26,855 hearing hours scheduled the preceding fiscal year. When coupled with the

decrease in number of cases filed, the trend in DOAH's caseload continues to show that while decreasing in raw number of cases filed, administrative cases continue to increase in length and complexity.

Appendix 1 breaks out by agency the utilization rates of
Division resources and demonstrates that, in descending order,
nine agencies utilize 85 percent of the Division's docket: the
Agency for Health Care Administration, Department of Business and
Professional Regulation, Department of Health, Department of
Environmental Protection, Department of Children and Family
Services, Department of Insurance, Department of Community
Affairs, Department of Transportation, and Department of
Management Services. Additionally, the Water Management Districts
have become a major user of the Division's services, and are
reported separately since they are covered by contractual
agreements. School districts are also major users and are
reported separately as well.

The following agencies have notably increased their hearing requests. The Department of Children and Family Services increased 16.74 percent from 233 cases filed in 1997 to 272 cases filed in 1998. Similarly, the Department of Health filed 328 cases in 1998, up 95 cases or 40.77 percent from the 233 cases filed the previous calendar year. Total referrals from the State's Water Management Districts also increased with 75 cases filed this year compared to 51 cases filed in 1997, which is an

increase of 47.06 percent. The Department of Management Services filed 99 cases in 1998, an increase of 33.78 percent over the 74 cases filed in 1997. Filings by the Ethics Commission in 1998 increased by 54.55 percent over the previous year. The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles filed a total of 53 cases in 1998, an increase of 47.22 percent over 1997.

UTILIZATION OF PERSONNEL

The Division has 71 established positions comprised of the Chief Judge, Deputy Chief Judge, 1 Executive Assistant, 3 Court Reporters, 33 Administrative Law Judges, 4 Administrative Assistants, 11 Administrative Secretaries, 1 Personnel Officer, 1 Budget Director, 1 Administrative Services Director, 1 Accountant, 1 Fiscal Assistant, 1 Purchasing Agent, 1 Distributed Computer Systems Analyst, 1 Office Automation Specialist, 1 Computer Operator, 1 Division Clerk, 1 Deputy Clerk Supervisor, 3 Deputy Clerks, 2 Staff Assistants, and 1 Senior Clerk.

In-House Court Reporters

The Division continues to employ three full-time court reporters. These reporters covered 56.66 percent of all DOAH Tallahassee hearings in FY 1997-98, which includes all final hearings, motion hearings, and prehearing conferences; .94 percent

of this total corresponds to video-taped hearings. The court reporters produced a total of 21,421 pages of transcription in FY 1997-98. See Appendix 2.

Statistics are collected on the cost avoidance to each state agency for their utilization of the Division's court reporters rather than private sector reporters for Tallahassee hearings. During FY 1997-98, the total cost avoidance to all state agencies utilizing DOAH's reporting services was \$93,600.24. The agencies with the greatest savings were the Constitution Revision Commission (\$22,034.10), Agency for Health Care Administration (\$22,005.64), and Department of Lottery (\$14,236.20). See Appendix 2.

The agencies realizing the greatest court reporting savings were the agencies that utilized the Division's in-house reporters the most. The primary users were the Agency for Health Care Administration (191.25 hours) and Constitution Revision Commission (151.00 hours), as seen in Appendix 2.

The State's costs exceeded savings by \$23,334.05 in FY 1997-98, compared with net savings of \$52,254.72 for FY 1996-97. The coverage of the Constitution Revision Commission (CRC) meetings, which was provided at no cost to that body, accounts for the fact that the cost was greater than savings for this fiscal year. The court reporters spent 151 hours in CRC session meetings, and 593.25 hours were spent producing the transcripts of the CRC

session meetings. This involvement greatly restricted the court reporters' ability to report many of the DOAH Tallahassee hearings that would normally be covered. This is further evidenced by the fact that the percent of DOAH Tallahassee hearings covered by in-house reporters dropped from 65.40 percent in FY 1996-97 to 56.66 percent in FY 1997-98. However, DOAH's service to the CRC allowed the State to enjoy significant savings in court reporting and transcription fees (\$22,034.10 at the contract reporting rates).

HEARING REQUESTS

During calendar year 1998, the Division processed 5,708 hearing requests, slightly under the 6,033 cases filed in 1997. Of the 5,708 cases, 2,347 were Baker Act cases. The remaining 3,361 cases were filed pursuant to Sections 120.535, 120.54, 120.56, and 120.57, Florida Statutes. The Baker Act caseload increased slightly in 1998 with 47 more cases filed when compared to the 2,300 referred in 1997. (See Appendix 3.)

Notable to the decrease in case filings is the number of referrals from the Department of Transportation (DOT). In 1998, DOT referred only 113 cases, a decrease of 50.66 percent when compared to the 229 referrals in 1997. The 58 referrals by the Department of Labor and Employment Security in 1998 also represent a decrease of 23.68 percent when compared to the 76

referrals in 1997. The Department of Revenue filed 94 cases in 1998, a decrease of 25.40 percent under the 126 cases filed in 1997.

In 1998 each Administrative Law Judge handled an average of 196 new cases (slightly down from 216 in 1997), conducted an average of 3,332 final hearings, and wrote an average of 113 recommended or final orders of varying length and complexity (compared to 106 in 1997).

In 1998 the Division held a total of 3,332 final hearings, compared to 3,287 in 1997. The Division closed 5,992 cases, an increase of 28 case closures compared to the 5,964 cases closed in 1997. This is an average of 203 closures per Judge, an increase of 15 percent compared to the 176 average number of closures per Judge the previous year.

OFFICE AUTOMATION

The primary systems applications for the Division are its

Case Management System (CMS) and a full-text retrieval and

document indexing application (PC DOCS Open). Secondary

applications include word processing, electronic mail and on-line

legal research via the Florida Legal Resource Center, Westlaw and

other Internet resources. In 1998, the Division focused on

enhancing its website (www.doah.state.fl.us) to provide public

access to its case management and document databases.

OPERATING BUDGET

The Division is 100 percent trust funded. Appendix 4 summarizes the Division's actual and estimated expenditures for FY 1997-98 and FY 1998-99, respectively. Appendix 4 also outlines funds requested in the Division's FY 1999-2000 Legislative Budget Request.

Each year the Division reports to the Legislature and the Governor's Office the total number of hearing hours scheduled by all agencies. Based on this data, the Division's budget is prorated among those agencies utilizing its services, and the Legislature appropriates fund transfers to the Division from those agencies. Hence, the amount each agency transfers to the Division is based on the number of hours it schedules for prehearing conferences, motion hearings, final hearings, and cancelled hearings in a given year. In August 1998, the Division submitted its twelfth report (see Appendix 1). Of the 30,238 hearing hours scheduled with the Division, a total of 23,825 hours were cancelled or continued.

The Division is also authorized to enter into contracts with cities, counties, regional planning councils, water management districts, and other organizations for the provision of Administrative Law Judge services. These organizations, as well as school districts and other educational entities, reimburse the Division for the costs of these services at the current contract rate and in accordance with applicable laws.

RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE A.P.A.

Chapter 96-159, Laws of Florida, substantially reorganized the Administrative Procedure Act. The Division has no current recommendations concerning this Act.
