TWENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

This report is submitted to the Administrative Procedures

Committee and to the Administration Commission in compliance with
the requirements of Section 120.65(10), Florida Statutes, which
provides:

Not later than February 1 of each year, the division shall issue a written report to the Administrative Procedures Committee and the Administration Commission, including at least the following information:

- (a) A summary of the extent and effect of agencies' utilization of administrative law judges, court reporters, and other personnel in proceedings under this chapter.
- (b) Recommendations for change or improvement in the Administrative Procedure Act or any agency's practice or policy with respect thereto.

GENERAL

Appendix 1 breaks out by agency the utilization rates of Division resources and demonstrates that, in descending order, nine agencies utilize 85 percent of the Division's docket: the

Agency for Health Care Administration, Department of Health,
Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Department of
Environmental Protection, Department of Children and Family
Services, Department of Community Affairs, Department of
Insurance, Department of Transportation, and Department of
Management Services. Additionally, the Water Management
Districts have become a major user of the Division's services,
and are reported separately since they are covered by contractual
agreements. School districts are also major users and are
reported separately as well.

UTILIZATION OF PERSONNEL

The Division has 75 positions comprised of the Director and Chief Judge, Deputy Chief Judge, 1 Executive Assistant, 3 Court Reporters, 37 Administrative Law Judges, 3 Administrative Assistants, 10 Administrative Secretaries, 1 Personnel Officer, 1 Budget Director, 1 Administrative Services Director, 1 Accountant, 1 Fiscal Assistant, 1 Purchasing Agent, 1 Distributed Computer Systems Analyst, 1 Office Automation Specialist, 1 Computer Operator, 1 Division Clerk, 1 Deputy Clerk Supervisor, 4 Deputy Clerks, 2 Staff Assistants, and 2 Senior Clerks.

IN-HOUSE COURT REPORTERS

The Division continues to employ three full-time court reporters. These reporters covered 73.07% of all DOAH

Tallahassee final hearings in FY 1998-99, and produced a total of 21,575 pages of transcription.

The combined cost avoidance to state agencies for their utilization of the Division's court reporters rather than private sector reporters for Tallahassee hearings during FY 1998-99 was approximately \$86,000.00.

The agencies realizing the greatest court reporting savings were the agencies that utilized the Division's in-house reporters the most.

In addition to the cost avoidance realized by other state agencies the court reporting program generated revenue in excess of \$80,000.00.

HEARING REQUESTS

During calendar year 1999, the Division processed 5,420 hearing requests. Of these cases, 2,240 were Baker Act cases. The remaining 3,180 cases were filed pursuant to Sections 120.535, 120.54, 120.56, and 120.57, Florida Statutes. The cases opened are itemized by agency in the attached Appendix 2.

In 1999, the following agencies markedly increased their hearing requests. The Department of Health referred 415 cases, an increase of 26.52 percent over the 328 cases filed the previous year. Notable to this agency increase is, 105 cases referred from the Board of Medicine, an increase of 29.63 percent when compared to the 81 cases filed in 1998. Referrals from the Board of Nursing also increased from 37 cases in 1998 to 103

cases filed in 1999, a significant increase of 178.38 percent. Similarly, the Water Management Districts filed 134 cases in 1999, a 78.67 percent increase over the 75 cases filed the previous year. Cases dealing with the placement of exceptional education students also increased significantly. These cases are expedited, requiring that a final order be issued 45 days after the request for hearing is filed, and are usually scheduled for a hearing date the same day that the Judge receives the case file. A total of 179 exceptional education cases were filed in 1999, an increase of 64 cases, or 55.65 percent, when compared to the 115 exceptional education cases filed in 1998.

In 1999 the Division held a total of 3,229 hearings and closed 5,362 cases. Each Administrative Law Judge handled an average of 175 new cases, conducted an average of 104 hearings, wrote an average of 90 recommended or final orders of varying length and complexity, and closed an average of 173 cases.

OFFICE AUTOMATION

The primary systems applications for the Division are its

Case Management System (CMS) and a full-text retrieval and

document indexing application. Secondary applications include

word processing, electronic mail and online legal research via

the Florida Legal Resource Center, Westlaw and other Internet

resources. In 1999, the Division implemented a new module in its

Case Management System which allows the automated generation of

form orders with minimal user input. Due to construction at the

Division's building, Administrative Law Judges were encouraged to telecommute and were provided with laptop computer and round-the-clock connections to the DOAH network.

OPERATING BUDGET

The Division is 100 percent trust funded. Appendix 3 summarizes the Division's actual and estimated expenditures for FY 1998-99 and FY 1999-2000, respectively. Appendix 3 also outlines funds requested in the Division's FY 2000-2001 Legislative Budget Request.

Each year the Division reports to the Legislature and the Governor's Office the total number of hearing hours scheduled by all agencies. Based on this data, the Division's budget is prorated among those agencies utilizing its services, and the Legislature appropriates fund transfers to the Division from those agencies. Hence, the amount each agency transfers to the Division is based on the number of hours it schedules for prehearing conferences, motion hearings, final hearings, and cancelled hearings in a given year. In August 1999, the Division submitted its thirteenth report (see Appendix 1). Of the 28,051 hearing hours scheduled with the Division, a total of 22,207 hours were cancelled or continued.

The Division is also authorized to enter into contracts with cities, counties, regional planning councils, water management districts, and other organizations for the provision of Administrative Law Judge services. These organizations, as well

as school districts and other educational entities, reimburse the Division for the costs of these services at the current contract rate and in accordance with applicable laws.

RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE A.P.A.

Chapter 96-159, Laws of Florida, substantially reorganized the Administrative Procedure Act. The Division has no current recommendations concerning this Act.
