## **NO NET LOSS OF HUNTING LANDS Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Report**

The 2006 Florida Legislature took action to commit the State of Florida to preserving hunting lands and hunting opportunities for the future. This document constitutes the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (Commission) annual report to the Legislature, required pursuant to section 379.3001, Florida Statutes (the "No Net Loss of Hunting Lands" legislation), on the status of hunting lands available to the public.

This report describes the acreage managed by the Commission that was closed to hunting during fiscal year 2009-2010, the reasons for the closures, and the acreage managed by the Commission that was opened to hunting to compensate for closures. As defined in statute, "Commission-managed lands" are lands owned by the Commission, lands owned by the State over which the Commission holds lead or cooperative management authority, or privately owned lands that are leased or managed by the Commission. Other state agencies and water management districts that own or manage land are also required in section 379.3001, Florida Statutes, to report properties with acreage open and closed to hunting during the previous fiscal year (except for right-of-way lands, parcels under 50 acres, and state parks).

Under the provisions of section 379.3001(4), Florida Statutes, Commission land management decisions and actions, including decisions made by private owners to close hunting land managed by the Commission, shall not result in any net loss of land acreage available for hunting opportunities on Commission-managed lands that existed on the effective date of the act (June 7, 2006). The law also requires that the Commission shall expeditiously find replacement acreage for hunting to compensate for closures of any existing hunting land. Furthermore, replacement lands shall, to the greatest extent possible, be located within the same administrative region of the Commission and shall be consistent with the hunting discipline that the Commission allowed on the closed land. Approximately 3,331,485 acres of Commission-managed public hunting land existed on the effective date of the act (June 7, 2006).

Since June 7, 2006, lands have been added and removed from the Wildlife Management Area system. The total acreage of Commission-managed public hunting lands existing on June 30, 2010 is 3,488,260 acres. Decisions and actions taken by the Commission since the adoption of the No Net Loss of Hunting Lands legislation have resulted in a net increase of 156,775 acres in Commission-managed hunting lands, as of June 30, 2010.

It is important to note that in addition to the 3,488,260 acres of Commission-managed public hunting lands, there were approximately 2,297,825 acres of federally-owned lands in the wildlife management area system available for public hunting during the 2009-2010 fiscal year, resulting in a total of 5,786,085 acres of land open for public hunting in Florida. The complete list of properties managed by the Commission or cooperatively managed that were open for public hunting during fiscal year 2009-2010 is provided in Table 1. A list of properties managed by the Commission or cooperatively managed that were not open for public hunting during fiscal year 2009-2010 is provided in Table 2. Table 3 provides information regarding Commission-managed lands that were removed from the wildlife management area system during fiscal year 2009-2010.

These lands all were removed at the request of the landowners. Please note that acreage figures reported herein may be revised based on final verification of these figures by cooperating landowners and agencies.
