	The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged is pleased to submit the 2011 Annual Performance Report, pursuant to Section 427.013(13), Florida Statutes.
	As you know, transportation plays a critical role in providing access to employment, health care, education, and other life-sustaining activities for many Floridians who are older adults, people with disabilities, or individuals with low incomes.
	During FY 2010-2011, over 700,000 Floridians used the Coordinated Transportation System to be productive citizens and actively participate in their local communities by taking over 51 million trips.

The Commission will also work with the Transportation Disadvantaged community and Managed Care Organizations to better prepare local community transportation coordinators to compete in Florida's future human services transportation marketplace.

We look forward to working with each of you to improve the Coordinated Transportation System that is a lifeline for so many of Florida's most vulnerable persons.

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### **Executive Summary**

Transportation plays a critical role in providing access to employment, health care, education, and other life-sustaining activities for many Floridians who are older adults, people with disabilities, individuals with low incomes, or at-risk children.

The Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged ensures the availability of efficient, cost-effective, and quality transportation services for transportation disadvantaged persons.

The Coordinated Transportation System, using statewide transportation professionals, provided 51.1 million trips to over 700,000 older adults, persons with disabilities, people with low income, or at-risk children. The Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (Commission) administers the Medicaid Non Emergency Transportation Program for the Agency for Health Care Administration. The Commission also promotes the use of pooled resources, both human and financial, to build upon a solid system.

A great example of the pooled resources is the paratransit shared ride system, a ride in which multiple riders share the cost of a trip. Using this system, the Coordinated Transportation System provided 15.2 million trips to our most vulnerable citizens. Another example of pooled resources is the utilization of the transit bus pass program. The bus pass program enables our contractors to provide transportation service for a fraction of the cost of a shared ride trip. When possible, contractors transfer every person from paratransit to transit. As reported in the 2011 Annual Performance Report, the Coordinated Transportation System provided 36 million trips via the fixed-route system. Cost-savings will continue to be a goal of the Commission.

A few highlights of the 2011 Annual Performance Report include:

- Over 700,000 Floridians used the Coordinated Transportation System – a 15 percent decrease since FY 2009-2010;
- The Coordinated Transportation System provided over 51.1 million trips – a one percent decrease since FY 2009-2010;
- Trips for medical, education and training, and nutrition increased 25 percent since FY 2009-2010, while trips for employment and other life-sustaining activities decreased 41 percent;
- The number of unmet trip requests decreased 66 percent and the number of "no-shows" decreased 13 percent since FY 2009-2010;

### Introduction

The 2011 Annual Performance Report for the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged is published to meet the statutory requirements outlined in Section 427.013(12), Florida Statutes, and covers the time period of July 1, 2010 - June 30, 2011.

This report provides an overview of the program and a summary of performance trends statewide. This information is compiled from each system's Annual Operating Report, thereby providing the Governor, Legislature, Commission, Community Transportation Coordinators, planning agencies, local Coordinating Boards, State Human Service agencies, advocacy groups and others statewide information on all coordinated transportation services. This report uses Fiscal Year 2009-2010 data for Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Counties. Upon receiving the data from these Counties, the Commission will update this report.

### **Mission**

The mission of Florida's Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged is to ensure the availability of efficient, costeffective, and quality transportation services for transportation disadvantaged persons.

### **Purpose of the Commission**

The Florida Legislature created the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (Commission) in 1989 to coordinate the transportation services provided to the transportation disadvantaged.

The goal of this coordination is to ensure the cost-effective provision of transportation by qualified community transportation coordinators or transportation operators for the transportation disadvantaged.

The authority of the Commission derives from Chapter 427.011-017, Florida Statutes, and Rule 41-2, Florida Administrative Code. The Commission also administers the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund (TDTF), which provides for carrying out the statutory responsibilities of the Commission.

The Commission is an independent agency located within the Department of Transportation for administrative and fiscal purposes. Otherwise, the Commission operates independently, with rule making and budget authority. The Commission employs staff in Tallahassee to administer and monitor the statutory requirements for the program.

### **Floridians Being Served**

Florida's transportation disadvantaged are defined in Chapter 427.011(1), F.S., as those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age, are unable to transport

themselves or to purchase transportation and are, therefore, dependent upon others to obtain access to health care, employment, education, shopping, social activities, or other life-sustaining activities, or children who are handicapped or high-risk as defined in s. 411.202, F.S.

A Study prepared by the Center for Urban Transportation Research reports that the potential transportation disadvantaged population in Florida is estimated to grow to 8.25 million by the Year 2015. This estimate is based on the State's population estimates for older adults, persons with disabilities, people with low income and at-risk children.

### **Commission Membership**

According to Chapter 427.012(1), F.S., the Commission shall consist of seven (7) voting members all appointed by the Governor, including five (5) Business Community Members; two (2) members who have a disability and use the Transportation Disadvantaged System. One of these members must be over 65 years of age. In addition, the Secretary of Transportation, the Secretary of Children and Families, the Director of the Agency for Workforce Innovation, the Executive Director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs, the Secretary of the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, and a county manager or administrator who is appointed by the Governor, or a senior management level of each, shall serve as ex officio non-voting advisors to the Commission. ### **Program Organization**

The Commission is the state-level policy board responsible for the oversight of the implementation of coordinated transportation disadvantaged services.

To assist with program implementation, the Commission contracts with a Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) and planning agency in each county.

The local CTC is responsible for the actual arrangement and/or delivery of transportation services for transportation disadvantaged persons. The CTC, through a competitive procurement process, may contract with local transportation operators to provide transportation for transportation disadvantaged persons. During Fiscal Year 2010-2011, 463 qualified transportation operators carried out the provision of services.

The Local Coordinating Board (LCB), appointed and staffed by the planning agency, oversees and annually evaluates the CTC, which the Commission approves. Local Coordinating Boards also provide assistance to the CTCs by identifying local service needs and providing information, advice and direction to CTCs on the coordination of services. Each Local Coordinating Board is an advisory body to the CTC in its service area.

Membership of each Local Coordinating Board includes the Chairperson of the Board, who is an elected official; representatives from the Departments of Transportation, Children and Families, Education, Elder Affairs, and Agency for Health Care Administration; a person over sixty representing the elderly; a person with a disability representing persons with disabilities; two (2) citizen advocate representatives (one who must be a user of the system); a representative of the local public education system; a person who is recognized by the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs, (representing the veterans of the county); a person who is recognized by the Florida Association for Community Action representing the economically disadvantaged; a representative of the local private for profit transportation industry; a representative for children at risk; a person representing the Regional Workforce Board; a representative of the local medical community; and where available, a representative of a local public transit system.

### **Commission Staff**

The Commission has twelve full-time and one part-time position that support and manage the statewide Transportation Disadvantaged Program. Where staffing levels are limited, the Commission outsources functions to independent contractors. The Executive Director provides oversight for staff and is directly accountable to the Commission.

### **Project Administration**

The management of the Project Administration Team is lead by the Assistant Director of Program Administration who reports to the Executive Director. During the Fiscal Year 2010-2011, there were four Project Managers who continuously provided training and technical assistance to all CTCs, Designated Official Planning Agencies, Subcontracted Transportation Providers, and others regarding the requirements of the Transportation Disadvantaged Program. The Project Managers provided contract management for 231 contracts, which included 63 Memorandums of Agreement, 55 Trip and Equipment Grants, 55 Medicaid Non-Emergency Transportation Service Subcontracts, 34 Planning Grants, and one contract for assistance with the Commission's annual training workshop.

#### **Quality Assurance and Program Evaluation Function**

The Quality Assurance function was outsourced to a private Certified Public Accounting firm to provide objectivity and financial oversight. During Fiscal Year 2010-11, this independent contractor conducted 40 Quality Assurance reviews of transportation providers.

#### **Public Relations Function**

In an effort to increase public awareness of, and assistance to Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged (TD), the Commission provides an Ombudsman Program and Toll Free TD Helpline. This program provides information and assistances in addressing people's concerns. In order to create awareness, education, and inclusion of the Transportation Disadvantaged, Commission Staff participates in conferences, public meetings and forums. In addition, the Commission Staff continues to assist the Department of Transportation with the implementation of the Toll Permit Program for qualified disabled drivers.

#### **Ombudsman Program/TD Helpline**

The Public Relations Team is responsible for the operation of the Ombudsman Program/TD Helpline. The Ombudsman Program began in 1994 to ensure the coordinated system provides quality customer service to transportation disadvantaged consumers. The primary goal of this program is to give consumers a forum to express concerns relating to services, as well as to provide the Commission with a tool to improve policies and program implementation. Ombudsman staff receives calls: documents concerns of the consumer: provides callers with information and assistance with complaint resolutions; refers callers to appropriate local area services; and maintains a database of information from all callers. A Customer Service Representative serves as a liaison between the caller and the CTC or the Medicaid Non Emergency Transportation (NET) Service Provider and provides assistance with resolving customer complaints and grievances. During this reporting period, staff received a total of 2,413 calls from consumers, including 1,138 calls from NET Medicaid riders.

Staff referred the majority of "quality of service" calls to the local area for intervention. Staff accomplished this by contacting the appropriate local CTC, NET Service Provider or planning agency to resolve the problem. Most calls were resolved on the same day, however, some required local investigation which may take longer to resolve. Additionally, the TD Helpline received calls requesting information on the Toll Permit/Sun Pass Program. These calls are not reflected in the total calls reported. Currently, staff operates the toll free number, 800-983-2435, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Voice mail capability is available during the evenings and weekends. Hearing and speech impaired callers may contact the Helpline by dialing 711 or (850) 410-5708.

#### **Toll Permit/SunPass**

The 1988 Florida Legislature created the Beverly Chapman Act that allowed qualified disabled drivers with upper limb impairments, to obtain a toll permit providing them non-revenue access to toll roads throughout Florida. Commission staff has provided assistance to the Department of Transportation with the implementation of this program and the development and implementation of the non-revenue SunPass transponder procedures. There were a total of 1,261 toll permits issued in Fiscal Year 2010-2011. There has been a total of 9,524 Toll Permits issued to date.

#### Annual Transportation Training And Technology Workshop/Conference

The 18th Annual Transportation Disadvantaged Training and Technology Conference was held July 13-14, 2010, in Orlando, Florida. This annual conference continues to provide an opportunity for CTCs, Planning Agencies, Purchasing Agencies, and Local Coordinating Board members to learn about the Transportation Disadvantaged Program and to share "best practices" as they relate to providing transportation services to the transportation disadvantaged. The conference also provides an opportunity to formally recognize outstanding achievements of individuals and/or agencies for their dedication and service to those who are considered transportation disadvantaged. Approximately 200 people attended the conference and attended various training sessions and workshops.

#### **Annual Performance Report**

Commission Staff gathers annual operating information from the Community Transportation Coordinator's (CTC's), state purchasing agencies and designated planning agencies to compile the Annual Performance Report (APR). Staff utilizes desk audit procedures to verify the data. This report provides operational statistics and trends on each coordinated transportation system and provides performance measures for all the coordinated systems.

### **Finance and Administration**

The Finance and Administration Team continued to develop and review policies and procedures used to detect and prevent financial shortfalls, fraud, and abuse. This team consists of the Assistant Director, Finance and Administration and a financial Manager. The Assistant Director of Finance and Administration reports to the Executive Director, providing accounting and technical assistance to the Commission, including work program activities, budget coordination, cash & investment monitoring and, cash flow forecasting. This position supervises the Financial Services Manager who handles the reimbursement processes for funds disbursed from the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund. This team also is responsible for securing and maintaining office space and equipment as necessary for Commission staff.

#### **Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund**

All 67 of Florida's counties expended trust fund dollars for the provision of transportation services for local transportation disadvantaged citizens whose transportation was not being subsidized by other funding programs. Planning agencies across the state also utilized trust fund dollars to assist in the development and evaluation of adequate and cost effective plans in order to meet the present and future needs of local transportation disadvantaged citizens.

The counties have been efficient in utilizing these funds, but still face daily trip denials due to lack of funding to meet the needs. During Fiscal Year 2010-2011, over 51.1 million trips were provided throughout the transportation disadvantaged coordinated systems, with a reported 7.9 million non-sponsored trips provided by the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund.

#### **Budget Fiscal Year 2010-2011**

For Fiscal Year 2010-2011, the Commission had a total budget of \$105.8 million. Of the total requested, approximately 36 percent funded the grant program that allows non-sponsored customers to receive transportation for daily living, and local expansion and improvement of the transportation service delivery system. The Commission used approximately one percent of the total budget for operational expenses. The Commission used the remainder of the funds to implement the Medicaid Non-Emergency Transportation Program.

#### **Revenue Estimates**

The Commission received a contract extension with the Agency for Health Care Administration through August 2012. As a result, the anticipated Revenue Estimates are as follows: FY 2011/2012 Estimate = \$106,951,187FY 2012/2013 Estimate = \$104,491,204FY 2013/2014 Estimate = \$40,009,356FY 2014/2015 Estimate = \$40,861,356FY 2015/2016 Estimate = \$41,476,356FY 2016/2017 Estimate = \$42,509,350

#### **Grant Program Status**

The Commission used \$37,078,144 of its \$38,404,800 allocation for FY 2010/2011, leaving a balance of \$1,326,656.

#### **Operating Budget Status**

The Commission used \$1,005,808 of its \$1,613,331 allocation for Fiscal Year 2010-2011, leaving a balance of \$607,523

### Medicaid Non Emergency Transportation

There are millions of people nationwide who depend upon their Medicaid coverage to provide transportation to and from essential medical services. Medicaid Non Emergency Transportation (NET) services ensure access to medical care for those people who are either unable to drive, cannot afford to own or maintain a vehicle and do not have access to affordable transportation. Medicaid NET services are particularly crucial in rural areas where distances to medical providers are often greater than in urban areas and where public transit alternatives are frequently non-existent. Medicaid funding is critical to Transportation providers who ensure Medicaid recipients have access to non-emergency health care.

In Florida, the Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) administers the state's Medicaid program which consists of both mandated and optional programs to carry out its mission. Transportation is a federally mandated service. This service is designed to be purchased through Florida's coordinated transportation system (Chapter 427, F.S.) in an effort to obtain maximum efficiencies and ensure the safety and well-being of riders.

The Commission has been providing transportation for AHCA under a fixed fee basis since 2004. The current multi-year contract between AHCA and the Commission was executed in December, 2008. Each month, the Commission receives a fixed amount of funding to provide all Medicaid NET services to eligible Medicaid beneficiaries. The Commission contracts with Community Transportation Coordinators (CTCs) to administer the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund and the Medicaid NET Program in their service areas. There are ten (10) counties where the designated CTC has declined to participate in the Medicaid NET program. These areas include: Brevard, Broward, Duval, Hillsborough, Manatee, Miami-Dade, Palm Beach, St. Lucie, Sarasota and Volusia. These areas are operated by Subcontracted Transportation Providers (STPs) who were either procured through a Request for Proposal (RFP) process or appointed by the Commission under emergency procedures. Sarasota County was the latest area to change providers which occurred at the end of Fiscal Year 2010-2011.

Commission Staff establishes policies for program implementation, collects and analyzes operational data from each CTC/STP, and develops and submits statewide reports to AHCA. Staff also operates an Ombudsman program to provide assistance to Medicaid beneficiaries who experience transportation problems.

During Fiscal Year 2010-2011, Commission Staff focused on assisting the CTCs/STPs in transitioning to the new electronic reporting system (CTDFL) to report their detailed Medicaid trip information. Although this task was challenging with new data field requirements, multiple software vendors, etc., all CTCs/STPs are now compliant with this requirement. The data was used as part of the Commission's efforts to review the funding formula for the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Medicaid allocations.

The statewide allocation for transportation services in Fiscal Year 2010-2011 was \$64,429,422.00. During this time, there were 2.7 million Medicaid non-emergency medical trips provided to 72,835 Medicaid beneficiaries. The table below is a statewide summary of the NET program highlights.

# **Glossary of Terms**

The following glossary is intended to coordinate terminology within the Florida Coordinated Transportation System. It is imperative that when certain words or phrases are used, the definition must be universally acknowledged.

Accidents: when used in reference to the AOR, the total number of reportable accidents that occurred whereby the result was either property damage of \$1000.00 or more, or personal injury that required evacuation to a medical facility, or a combination of both.

Actual Expenditure Report (AER): an annual report completed by each state member agency and each official planning agency, to inform the Commission in writing, before September 15 of each year, of the specific amount of funds the agency expended for transportation disadvantaged services.

Advance Reservation Service: shared or individual paratransit service that is readily delivered with at least prior day notification, seven days a week, 24 hours a day.

**Agency:** an official, officer, commission, authority, council, committee, department, division, bureau, board, section, or any other unit or entity of the state or of a city, town, municipality, county, or other local governing body or a private non-profit transportation service providing entity.

**Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA):** a federal law, P.L. 101-336, signed by the President of the United States on July 26, 1990 providing protection for persons with disabilities.

Annual Operating Report (AOR): an annual report prepared by the community transportation coordinator detailing its designated service area operating statistics for the most recent operating year.

Annual Performance Report (APR): an annual report issued by the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged that combines all the data submitted in the Annual Operating Reports and the Commission's Annual Report.

Automotive Service Excellence (ASE): a series of tests that certify the skills of automotive technicians in a variety of maintenance areas.

**Availability:** a measure of the capability of a transportation system to be used by potential riders, such as the hours the system is in operation, the route spacing, the seating availability, and the pick-up and delivery time parameters.

**Bus:** any motor vehicle designed for carrying more than 10 passengers and used for the transportation of persons for compensation.

**Bus Lane:** a street or highway lane intended primarily for buses, either all day or during specified periods, but used by other traffic under certain circumstances.

**Bus Stop:** a waiting, boarding, and disembarking area, usually designated by distinctive signs and by curbs or pavement markings.

**Center for Urban Transportation Research (CUTR):** a research group located at the University of South Florida's College of Engineering.

**Certified Minority Business Enterprise (CMBE):** any small business concern which is organized to engage in commercial

transactions, which is domiciled in Florida, and which is at least 51 percent owned by minority persons and whose management and daily operations are controlled by such persons. These businesses should be certified by the Florida Department of Management Services.

**Chapter 427, Florida Statutes:** the Florida statute establishing the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged and prescribing its duties and responsibilities.

**Commendation:** any documented compliment of any aspect of the coordinated system, including personnel, vehicle, service, etc.

**Commercial Driver's License (CDL):** a license required if a driver operates a commercial motor vehicle, including a vehicle that carries 16 or more passengers (including the driver), or a vehicle weighing more than 26,000 pounds.

**Commission:** the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged as authorized in Section 427.013, Florida Statutes.

**Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged** (**Commission**): an independent agency created in 1989 to accomplish the coordination of transportation services provided to the transportation disadvantaged. Replaced the Coordinating Council on the Transportation Disadvantaged.

**Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC):** (formerly referred to as "coordinated community transportation provider") a transportation entity competitively procured or recommended by the appropriate official planning agency and local Coordinating Board and approved by the Commission, to

ensure that safe, quality coordinated transportation services are provided or arranged in a cost effective manner to serve the transportation disadvantaged in a designated service area.

**Competitive Procurement:** obtaining a transportation operator or other services through a competitive process based upon Commission-approved procurement guidelines, as established in accordance with Chapter 287, Florida Statutes.

**Complaint:** any documented customer concern involving timeliness, vehicle condition, quality of service, personnel behavior, and other operational policies.

**Complete (or Full) Brokerage:** type of CTC network in which the CTC does not provide any on-street transportation services itself, but contracts with transportation operators or coordination contractors for the delivery of all transportation services.

**Coordinated Transportation System:** includes the CTC, the transportation operators and coordination contractors under contract with the CTC, the official planning agency, and local Coordinating Board involved in the provision of service delivery to the transportation disadvantaged within the designated service area.

**Coordinated Trips:** passenger trips provided by or arranged through a CTC.

**Coordinating Board:** an entity in each designated service area composed of representatives who provide assistance to the community transportation coordinator relative to the coordination of transportation disadvantaged services.

**Coordination:** the arrangement for the provision of transportation services to the transportation disadvantaged in a manner that is cost effective, safe, efficient, and reduces fragmentation and duplication of services. Coordination is not the same as total consolidation of transportation disadvantaged services in any given service area.

**Coordination Contract:** a written contract between the community transportation coordinator and an agency who receives transportation disadvantaged funds and performs some, if not all of, its own services, as well as services to others, when such service has been analyzed by the CTC and proven to be a safer, more effective and more efficient service from a total system perspective. The Commission's standard contract reflects the specific terms and conditions that will apply to those agencies who perform their own transportation, as well as joint utilization and cost provisions for transportation services to and from the coordinator.

**Deadhead:** the miles or hours that a vehicle travels when out of revenue service. From dispatch point to first pick-up, and from last drop-off to home base, or movements from home base to maintenance garage or fuel depot, and return.

**Demand Response:** a paratransit service that is readily delivered with less than prior day notification, seven days a week, 24 hours a day. This service can be either an individual or shared ride.

**Designated Service Area:** a geographical area subject to approval by the Commission, which defines the community where coordinated transportation services will be provided to the transportation disadvantaged.

**Disabled Passenger:** anyone with a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits at least one of the major life activities (i.e., caring for one's self, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, learning).

**Dispatcher:** the person responsible for having every scheduled run leave the yard or garage on time and maintain a schedule, matching the work force with the work load on a minute-by-minute basis. In demand-response transportation, the person who assigns the customers to vehicles and notifies the appropriate drivers.

**Driver Hour:** the period of one hour that a person works whose main responsibility is to drive vehicles.

**Economies of Scale:** cost savings resulting from combined resources (e.g., joint purchasing agreements that result in a lower cost per gallon or quantity discount for fuel).

**Effectiveness Measure:** a performance measure that indicates the level of consumption per unit of output. Passenger trips per vehicle mile is an example of an effectiveness measure.

**Efficiency Measure:** a performance measure that evaluates the level of resources expended to achieve a given level of output. An example of an efficiency measure is operating cost per vehicle mile.

**Emergency:** any occurrence, or threat thereof, whether accidental, natural or caused by man, in war or in peace, which results or may result in substantial denial of services to a designated service area for the transportation disadvantaged.

**Emergency Fund:** transportation disadvantaged trust fund monies set aside to address emergency situations and which can be utilized by direct contract, without competitive bidding, between the Commission and an entity to handle transportation services during a time of emergency.

**Employees:** the total number of persons employed in an organization.

**Fixed Route:** (also known as Fixed Route/Fixed Schedule) service in which the vehicle (s) repeatedly follows a consistent time schedule and stopping points over the same route, whereby such schedule, route or service is not at the users request (e.g. conventional city bus, fixed guideway).

Florida Administrative Code (FAC): a set of administrative codes regulating the State of Florida.

**Florida Coordinated Transportation System (FCTS):** a transportation system responsible for coordination and service provisions for the transportation disadvantaged as outlined in Chapter 427, Florida Statutes.

**Florida Department Of Transportation (FDOT):** a governmental entity. The Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged is housed under the Florida Department of Transportation for administrative purposes.

Florida Statutes (FS): the laws governing the State of Florida.

**Full Time Equivalent (FTE):** a measure used to determine the number of employees based on a 40-hour work week. One FTE equals 40 work hours per week.

**Fully Allocated Costs:** the total cost, including the value of donations, contributions, grants or subsidies, of providing coordinated transportation, including those services which are purchased through transportation operators or provided through coordination contracts.

**General Trips:** passenger trips by individuals to destinations of their choice, not associated with any agency program.

**Goal:** broad conditions that define what the organization hopes to achieve.

**Grievance System:** is used as the term by Medicaid to describe it's process for addressing Actions, Complaints, Appeals, and Grievances. It is the Medicaid system for reviewing and resolving Medicaid Beneficiary Grievances and Appeals. Components must include a Complaint Procedure, a Grievance Procedure, an Appeal Process, and access to the Medicaid Fair Hearing system.

**Grievance Process or Procedure:** a formal grievance is a written complaint to document any concern or an unresolved service complaint regarding the separation or administration of TD service by the Transportation Operator, Community Transportation Coordinator, designated official planning agency, or local Coordinating Board. Provides a channel for the adjustment of grievances through discussions at progressively higher levels of authority, culminating in mediation, if necessary.

**In Service:** the time a vehicle begins the route to provide transportation service to the time the route is completed.

**In-Take Clerk/Reservationist:** an individual whose primary responsibility is to accept requests for trips, enter dates on requests, determine eligibility and provide customer service.

**Latent Demand:** demand that is not active (i.e., the potential demand of persons who are not presently in the market for a good or service).

**Limited Access:** the inability of a vehicle, facility or equipment to permit entry or exit to all persons. Lack of accessibility of vehicle, facility or other equipment.

**Load Factor:** the ratio of use to capacity of equipment or a facility during a specified time period.

**Local Government:** an elected and/or appointed public body existing to coordinate, govern, plan, fund, and administer public services within a designated, limited geographic area of the state.

**Local Government Comprehensive Plan:** a plan that meets the requirements of Chapters 163.3177 and 163.3178, Florida Statutes.

**Local Coordinating Board (LCB):** an entity in each designated service area composed of representatives appointed by the official planning agency. Its purpose is to provide assistance to the community transportation coordinator concerning the coordination of transportation disadvantaged services.

**Management Information System (MIS):** the mechanism that collects and reports key operating and financial information for managers on a continuing and regular basis.

**Medicaid Non Emergency Transportation:** An appropriate means of conveyance furnished to a Medicaid Beneficiary to obtain Medicaid compensable services.

**Memorandum of Agreement (MOA):** the state contract included in the transportation disadvantaged service plan for transportation disadvantaged services purchased by federal, state, or local government transportation disadvantaged funds. This agreement is between the Commission and the community transportation coordinator and recognizes the community transportation coordinator as being responsible for the arrangement of the provision of transportation disadvantaged services for a designated service area.

**Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO):** the area-wide organization responsible for conducting the continuous, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning and programming in accordance with the provisions of 23 U.S.C. s. 134, as provided in 23 U.S.C. s. 104(f)(3). Also serves as the official planning agency referred to in Chapter 427, F.S.

**Network type:** describes how a community transportation coordinator provides service, whether as a complete brokerage, partial brokerage, or sole provider.

**Non-coordinated Trip:** a trip provided by an agency, entity, or operator who is in whole or in part subsidized by local, state, or federal funds, and who does not have coordination/operator contract with the community transportation coordinator.

**Nonsponsored Trip:** transportation disadvantaged services that are sponsored in whole by the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund.

**Objective:** specific, measurable conditions that the organization establishes to achieve its goals.

**Off Peak:** a period of day or night during which travel activity is generally low and a minimum of transit service is operated.

**Official Planning Agency (OPA):** the official body or agency designated by the Commission to fulfill the functions of transportation disadvantaged planning. The Metropolitan Planning Organization shall serve as the planning agency in areas covered by such organizations.

**Operating Cost:** the sum of all expenditures that can be associated with the operation and maintenance of the system during the particular period under consideration.

**Operating Cost per Driver Hour:** operating costs divided by the number of driver hours, a measure of the cost efficiency of delivered service.

**Operating Cost per Passenger Trip:** operating costs divided by the total number of passenger trips, a measure of the efficiency of transporting riders. One of the key indicators of comparative performance of transit properties since it reflects both the efficiency with which service is delivered and the market demand for the service.

**Operating Cost per Vehicle Mile:** operating costs divided by the number of vehicle miles, a measure of the cost efficiency of delivered service.

**Operating Environment:** describes whether the community transportation coordinator provides service in an urban or rural service area.

**Operating Expenses:** sum of all expenses associated with the operation and maintenance of a transportation system.

**Operating Revenues:** all revenues and subsidies utilized by the operator in the provision of transportation services.

**Operating Statistics:** data on various characteristics of operations, including passenger trips, vehicle miles, operating costs, revenues, vehicles, employees, accidents, and roadcalls.

**Operator Contract:** a written contract between the community transportation coordinator and a transportation operator to perform transportation services.

**Organization Type:** describes the structure of a community transportation coordinator, whether it is a private-for-profit, private non-profit, government, quasi-government, or transit agency.

**Paratransit:** elements of public transit that provide service between specific origins and destinations selected by the individual user with such service being provided at a time that is agreed upon between the user and the provider of the service. Paratransit services are provided by sedans, vans, buses, and other vehicles.

**Partial Brokerage:** type of CTC network in which the CTC provides some of the on-street transportation services and contracts with one or more other transportation operators, including coordination contractors, to provide the other portion of the on-street transportation disadvantaged services, including coordination contractors.

**Passenger Miles:** a measure of service utilization which represents the cumulative sum of the distances ridden by each passenger. This is a duplicated mileage count. For example: If 10 people ride together for 10 miles, there would be 100 passenger miles.

**Passenger Trip:** a unit of service provided each time a passenger enters the vehicle, is transported, then exits the vehicle. Each different destination would constitute a passenger trip. This unit of service is also known as a one-way passenger trip.

**Passenger Trips per Driver Hour:** a performance measure used to evaluate service effectiveness by calculating the total number of passenger trips divided by the number of driver hours.

**Passenger Trips per Vehicle Mile:** a performance measure used to evaluate service effectiveness by calculating the total number of passenger trips divided by the number of vehicle miles.

**Performance Measure:** statistical representation of how well an activity, task, or function is being performed. Usually computed from operating statistics by relating a measure of service output or utilization to a measure of service input or cost.

**Potential TD Population:** (formerly referred to as TD Category I) includes persons with disabilities, senior citizens, low income persons, and high risk or at risk children. These persons are eligible to receive certain governmental and social service agency subsidies for program-related trips.

**Program Trip:** a passenger trip supplied or sponsored by a human service agency for the purpose of transporting clients to and from a program of that agency (e.g., sheltered workshops, congregate dining, and job training).

**Public Transit:** means the transporting of people by conveyances or systems of conveyances traveling on land or water, local or regional in nature, and available for use by the public. Public transit systems may be governmental or privately owned. Public transit specifically includes those forms of transportation commonly known as paratransit.

**Purchased Transportation:** transportation services provided for an entity by a public or private transportation provider based on a written contract.

Request for Bids (RFB): a competitive procurement process.

**Request for Proposals (RFP):** a competitive procurement process.

**Request for Qualifications (RFQ):** a competitive procurement process.

**Reserve Fund:** transportation disadvantaged trust fund monies set aside each budget year to insure adequate cash is available for incoming reimbursement requests when estimated revenues do not materialize.

**Revenue Hours:** total vehicle hours used in providing passenger transportation, excluding deadhead time.

**Revenue Miles:** the total number of paratransit service miles driven while TD passengers are actually riding on the vehicles. This figure should be calculated from first passenger pick-up

until the last passenger drop-off, excluding any breaks in actual passenger transport. For example: if 10 passengers rode 10 miles together, there would be 10 revenue miles.

**Ridesharing:** the sharing of a vehicle by clients of two or more agencies, thus allowing for greater cost efficiency and improved vehicle utilization.

**Roadcall:** any in-service interruptions caused by failure of some functionally necessary element of the vehicle, whether the rider is transferred or not. Roadcalls exclude accidents.

**Rule 41-2, F.A.C.:** the rule adopted by the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged to implement provisions established in Chapter 427, F.S.

**Scheduler:** a person who prepares an operating schedule for vehicles on the basis of passenger demand, level of service, and other operating elements such as travel times or equipment availability.

**Shuttle:** a transit service that operates on a short route, or in a small geographical area, often as an extension to the service of a longer route.

**Sole Source:** (also referred to as Sole Provider) network type in which the CTC provides all of the transportation disadvantaged services.

**Sponsored Trip:** a passenger trip that is subsidized in part or in whole by a local, state, or federal government funding source (not including monies provided by the TD Trust Fund).

**Standard:** something established by authority, custom, or general consent as a model or example.

**Stretcher Service:** a form of non-emergency paratransit service whereby the rider is transported on a stretcher, litter, gurney, or other device that does not meet the dimensions of a wheelchair as defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act.

**Subcontracted Transportation Provider (STP):** any person or entity with which the recipient has contracted or delegated, by use of a subcontract, some of its functions, services, or responsibilities for providing transportation services.

**Subscription Service:** a regular and recurring service in which schedules are prearranged, to meet the travel needs of riders who sign up for the service in advance. The service is characterized by the fact that the same passengers are picked up at the same location and time and are transported to the same location, and then returned to the point of origin in the same manner.

**System Safety Program Plan (SSPP):** a documented organized approach and guide to accomplishing a system safety program set forth in Florida Rule 14-90.

**Total Fleet:** this includes all revenue vehicles held at the end of the fiscal year, including those in storage, emergency contingency, awaiting sale, etc.

**Total Quality Management (TQM):** a management philosophy utilizing measurable goals and objectives to achieve quality management practices.

**Transportation Alternative:** those specific transportation services that are approved by rule to be acceptable transportation alternatives, and defined in s. 427.018, F. S.

**Transportation Disadvantaged (TD):** those persons, including children as defined in s. 411.202 F.S., who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or inability to drive due to age or disability are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation and have no other form of transportation available. These persons are, therefore, dependent upon others to obtain access to health care, employment, education, shopping, or medically necessary or life-sustaining activities.

**Transportation Disadvantaged Funds:** any local government, state or available federal funds that are for the transportation of the transportation disadvantaged. Such funds may include, but are not limited to, funds for planning, Medicaid NET transportation, transportation provided pursuant to the ADA, administration of transportation disadvantaged services, operation, procurement and maintenance of vehicles or equipment, and capital investments. Transportation disadvantaged funds do not include funds expended by school districts for the transportation of children to public schools or to receive service as a part of their educational program.

**Transportation Disadvantaged Population:** (formerly referred to as TD Category II) persons, including children, who, because of disability, income status, or inability to drive due to age or disability are unable to transport themselves.

**Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan (TDSP):** a fiveyear implementation plan, with annual updates developed by the CTC and the planning agency which contains the provisions of service delivery in the coordinated transportation system. The plan shall be reviewed and recommended by the local Coordinating Board. **Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund:** a fund administered by the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged in which all fees collected for the transportation disadvantaged program shall be deposited. The funds deposited will be appropriated by the legislature to the Commission to carry out the Commission's responsibilities. Funds that are deposited may be used to subsidize a portion of a transportation disadvantaged person's transportation costs which are not sponsored by an agency.

**Transportation Operator:** a public, private for profit, or private non-profit entity engaged by the community transportation coordinator to provide service to the transportation disadvantaged pursuant to an approved coordinated transportation system transportation disadvantaged service plan.

**Transportation Operator Contract:** the Commission's standard coordination/operator contract between the community transportation coordinator and the transportation operator that outlines the terms and conditions for any services to be performed.

**Trend Analysis:** a common technique used to analyze the performance of an organization over a period of time.

**Trip Priorities:** various methods for restricting or rationing trips.

**Trip Sheet:** a record kept of specific information required by ordinance, rule or operating procedure for a period of time worked by the driver of a public passenger vehicle in demandresponse service. Also known as a driver log.

**Unduplicated Passenger Head Count (UPHC):** the actual number of people that were provided paratransit transportation services, not including personal care attendants, non-paying escorts, or persons provided fixed schedule/fixed route service.

**Unmet Trip Requests/Unmet Need:** the number of trips desired but not provided because of insufficient service supply, most commonly due to lack of adequate funding.

**Urbanized Area:** a city (or twin cities) that has a population of 50,000 or more (central city) and surrounding incorporated and unincorporated areas that meet certain criteria of population size of density.

**U.S. Department of Health and Human Services** (USDHHS): a federal agency regulating health and human services.

**U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT):** a federal agency regulating the transportation field.

**Van Pool:** a prearranged ride-sharing service in which a number of people travel together on a regular basis in a van. Van pools are commonly a company-sponsored van that has a regular volunteer driver.

**Vehicle Inventory:** an inventory of vehicles used by the CTC, transportation operators, and coordination contractors for the provision of transportation disadvantaged services.

**Vehicle Miles:** the total distance traveled by revenue vehicles, including both revenue miles and deadhead miles.

**Vehicle Miles per Vehicle:** a performance measure used to evaluate resource utilization and rate of vehicle depreciation, calculated by dividing the number of vehicle miles by the total number of vehicles.

**Vehicles:** number of vehicles owned by the transit agency that are available for use in providing services.

**Volunteers:** individuals who do selected tasks for the community transportation coordinator or its contracted operator, for little or no compensation.

**Will-Calls:** these are trips that are requested on a demand response basis, usually for a return trip. The transportation provider generally knows to expect a request for a will-call trip, but cannot schedule the trip in advance because the provider does not know the exact time a passenger will call to request his/her trip.
