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THE BREAST CANCER EARLY DETECTION AND TREATMENT REFERRAL PROGRAM

The 2009 Legislature passed section 381.932, *Florida Statutes*, the Florida Breast Cancer Early Detection and Treatment Referral Program, which became effective July 1, 2009. This statute requires that the State Surgeon General submit an annual report to the appropriate substantive committees of the Legislature that includes a description of the rate of breast cancer morbidity and mortality in the state and the extent to which women are participating in breast cancer screening as reported by the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS). This report uses 2008 data, the most recent available.





Figure two presents the age-specific incidence rates in 2008.





Figure four presents the age-specific mortality rates in 2008.






