Rules will be necessary to implement the new statute in residential facilities and in secure detention centers.

** Ch. 2018-086 amends the statutes governing detention criteria. The Detention Risk Assessment Instrument (DRAI), currently incorporated in rule 63D-9, will be amended in time for the new statutes to take effect in July 2019.

*** Ch. 2018-127 created section 985.126, F.S., requiring the collection and publication of data concerning the use of diversion programs.


