

From July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023

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#### I. <u>Introduction</u>

Pursuant to the contract between the Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design ("Board") and Manausa, Shaw & Minacci, P.A. ("Contractor"), dated July 1, 2020, which privatizes the disciplinary functions of the Board, the Contractor is to provide a report describing all the activities related to the Privatization Contract for the previous fiscal year. The fiscal year began on July 1, 2022, and ended June 30, 2023.

In the annual report, the Contractor will provide the following information:

- 1. Any audit performed, including financial reports and performance audits.
- 2. The number of complaints received, the number of complaints determined to be legally sufficient, the number of complaints dismissed, and the number of complaints determined to have probable cause.
- 3. The number of administrative complaints issued and the status of the complaints.
- 4. The number and nature of disciplinary actions taken by the Board.
- 5. All revenue received and all expenses incurred by the Contractor over the previous 12 months in its performance of the duties under the contract.
- 6. The status of the compliance of the contractor with all performance-based program measures adopted by the Board.

#### II. Summary

The following chart summarizes the information that will be provided throughout the report. The chart is based only on those activities that took place during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, compared to the last two years under the contract.

#### III. Any audit performed, including financial reports and performance audits.

As of June 30, 2022, an audit was not performed in relation to the contract which covered the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023.

## IV. The number of complaints received, the number of complaints determined to be legally sufficient, the number of complaints dismissed, and the number of complaints determined to have probable cause.

#### A. Number of complaints received.

For the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the Contractor received 178 complaints. This is an average of over 14 complaints a month for this 12-month period. For the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, the Contractor received 142 complaints. This is an average of over 11 complaints a month for this 12-month period. For the period of July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, the Contractor received 261 complaints. This is an average of over 22 complaints a month for this 12-month period.

When the Contractor began providing services to the Board, the Department had only 91 active cases as of November 1, 2002, with some cases dating back to November 1, 1999.

The Contractor has spoken to many groups throughout the State of Florida, and the various professional associations for architects and interior designers have publicized the successes of the privatization effort; this result has led to a greater number of complaints getting processed in a quicker manner he Contractor also maintains a website located at www.ManausaLaw.com. At this site, the public can obtain information about filing a complaint and view summaries of the cases that the Contractor has prosecuted.

#### B. The number of complaints determined to be legally sufficient.

For the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the Contractor determined 171 of the 178 complaints received were legally sufficient (96%). For the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, the Contractor determined 138 of the 142 complaints received were legally sufficient (97%). For the period of July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, the Contractor determined 251 of the 261 complaints received were legally sufficient (96%).

This is a critical step in the disciplinary process because once legal sufficiency as specified in 455,225(1)(a), F.S, is determined, a full investigation is conducted, and the case is presented to the Probable Cause Panel.

The following is a summary of the 171 complaints filed after June 30, 2022, that were determined to be legally sufficient, compared to the legally sufficient complaints filed during the prior two years:

The Contractor opened an average of 14 investigations a month during this period. The Contractor initiated full investigations on over 96% of the complaints that were filed between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023.

A list of the status of all legally sufficient cases that are being prosecuted can be found as Exhibit "A" attached to this report. The Contractor has removed the names of the cases that were not public record as of June 30, 2023; however, the information regarding these cases is included in the report.

Of the 171 cases which were handled by the Contractor and legal sufficiency was determined, the status of the cases between investigation and legal as of June 30, 2023, is as follows, compared to the status of the cases to the two prior periods:

#### C. The number of complaints dismissed.

During the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the Contractor dismissed 7 cases as legally insufficient and 0 complaint as duplicative. The Contractor reviews each case for legal sufficiency very thoroughly because if it is dismissed at this stage no further investigation is initiated.

The Contractor is closing less than 4% of the complaints as legally insufficient or duplicative cases; however, the public can be assured that these closures are justified given the greater level of review by experienced individuals encompassing an investigator and an attorney, both agree with the closure.

During the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the Probable Cause Panel dismissed 74 cases with a finding of no probable cause. The cases are divided among the professions, along with a comparison of the cases closed during the prior two periods:

#### D. The number of complaints determined to have probable cause.

During the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, probable cause was found in 90 cases. These cases were heard during four Probable Cause Panel meetings held on the following dates:

July 26, 2022 - West Palm Beach, Florida October 27, 2022 - Sarasota, Florida January 19, 2023 - Daytona Beach, Florida May 11, 2023 - St. Augustine, Florida

## V. The number of Administrative Complaints issued and the status of the complaints.

Of the 90 cases in which probable cause was found during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, there were

- 0 cases resulted in a Citation;
- 1 case resulted in a Notice of Non-Compliance;
- 78 cases resulted in an Administrative Complaint; and
- 11 cases resulted in a Notice and Order to Cease and Desist.

The following chart is a breakdown by professions of the Administrative Complaints which were filed during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, along with the numbers for the prior two periods under the contract:

The status of the 78 cases in which an Administrative Complaint was filed can be found in the case summary as Exhibit "A". The facts surrounding the finding of probable cause can be found in the Probable Cause Panel summary as Exhibit "B".

#### VI. The number and nature of disciplinary actions taken by the Board.

The Board took disciplinary action on 66 cases during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. The Board took disciplinary action on 48 cases during the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022. The Board took disciplinary action on 112 cases during the period of July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021.

The nature of the disciplinary action taken by the Board can be found as Exhibit "C", which is also posted on the Contractor's website at www.ManausaLaw.com.

## VII. All revenue received and all expenses incurred by the Contractor over the previous 12 months in its performance of the duties under the contract.

During the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the Contractor received \$443,203.99 as revenue under the contract. The income does not include those invoices that were paid after June 30, 2023.

The expenses incurred by the Contractor during this time period total\$384,566.31. The expenses do not include those services that occurred during this period of the contract and were paid after June 30, 2023.

## VIII. The status of the compliance of the Contractor with all performance-based program measures adopted by the Board.

The contract lists 10 performance measures for the term of the contract. The Contractor has complied with a majority of the performance measures. It should be emphasized that the performance measures are provided only as a guide to monitor the Contractor throughout the term of the contract. The performance measures were developed to serve as a goal for the Contractor to achieve, without taking into account a large increase in the number of complaints that have occurred under the privatization model.

A. Legal sufficiency will be determined within seven days of receipt of the complaint, unless a preliminary investigation is requested by the Contractor. Upon conclusion of the preliminary investigation, which will be concluded within 14 days, unless circumstances outside the control of the Contractor are present, legal sufficiency will be determined within seven days of the completion of the preliminary investigation.

The Contractor received 178 complaints during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, and legal sufficiency was determined within seven days of receipt of the complaint. The Contractor has complied with this performance measure.

B. Pursuant to Section 455.225(1)(b), Florida Statutes, when an investigation of any Subject is undertaken, the Subject or the Subject's attorney shall be furnished a copy of the complaint or documents that resulted in the initiation of the investigation. This will occur within seven days of the finding of legal sufficiency.

Of the 171 complaints in which legal sufficiency was found during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, in every case the Subject or the Subject's attorney was furnished a copy of the complaint or documents that resulted in the initiation of the investigation within seven days of the finding of legal sufficiency. The Contractor has complied with this performance measure.

C. The Contractor will confirm corrective action is taken within 15 days of the issuance of the notice of noncompliance. If the Subject cannot demonstrate that the violation was corrected within such time, regular disciplinary proceedings will be initiated.

Rule 61G1-12.007, Florida Administrative Code, sets forth minor offenses for which a notice of non-compliance may be issued. There was one notice of non-compliance for offenses listed in Rule 61G1-12.007 issued during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. The Contractor has complied with this performance measure.

D. It is the goal of the Contractor to complete all investigations within 60 days of a finding of legal sufficiency. If this is not possible due to the facts of the case, the file will be documented setting forth the circumstances surrounding the delay. Furthermore, for those investigations that exceed 75 days from the finding of legal sufficiency, the appropriate Consultant will be requested to review the file for guidance.

Of the 153 cases in which legal sufficiency was determined and the investigation was completed within the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the investigation was completed within 60 days of a finding of legal sufficiency in 30 cases or in 20 % of the legally sufficient complaints filed. In 105 cases, the investigation exceeded seventy-five (75) days from the finding of legal sufficiency.

E. Letters of guidance will be drafted by the Contractor and provided to members of the probable cause panel when requested prior to issuance. Letters of guidance will be mailed within seven days of the conclusion of the probable cause hearing.

During the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the Contractor issued seven letters of guidance. The Contractor has complied with this performance measure.

F. Within seven days of the decision by the Probable Cause Panel, the Contractor will revise the administrative complaint based upon the Panel's recommendations and serve the Subject.

During the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, probable cause was found on 78 Administrative Complaints. All the Administrative Complaints were mailed within seven days of the Probable Cause Panel meeting or within seven days of receiving the Administrative Complaint from the Agency Clerk. The Contractor has complied with this performance measure.

## G. If the Subject elects a formal hearing, the case will be forwarded to the Division of Administrative Hearings within five days.

During the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, a formal hearing was requested in four cases. In this case, in which a formal hearing was elected, the file was forwarded to the Division of Administrative Hearings within five days.

H. The Contractor will only have the authority to request or consent to one continuance. If the Contractor believes a second continuance is in the best interest of the Board, the consent of the Consultant will be required. If the Contractor is requested to consent to a third continuance, the approval of the Board Chair is required.

Of the four cases filed with the Division of Administrative Hearings during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, a continuance was not requested by the Contractor. The Contractor has complied with this performance measure.

I. The Contractor will, within 30 days of the Cease and Desist Order, confirm that the activity has ceased.

During the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the Contractor issued 11 Notice and Orders to Cease and Desist. The Contractor confirms the activity has ceased by requiring the Subject to sign an affidavit stating the problem has been corrected. The affidavit must be returned within 30 days, or an Administrative Complaint is filed. The Contractor has complied with this performance measure.

J. The Contractor will refer to the Board any investigation or disciplinary proceeding not before the Division of Administrative Hearings or otherwise completed within one year of the filing of the complaint per Section 455.225(4), Florida Statutes.

As of June 30, 2023, there were no active cases in which the investigation was not concluded, or disciplinary proceedings were not initiated before the Division of Administrative Hearings within one year of the filing of the complaint.

#### IX. <u>Miscellaneous Activities of the Contractor</u>

**Collection Success** – In addition to the other disciplinary functions referenced above, the Contractor has also taken over the monitoring compliance for all final orders. This includes collection of fines/costs and pursuing collection efforts in-house when necessary.

As of June 30, 2023, the Contractor has collected \$3,299,608.41 in fines and costs during the first 248 months under the contract. Therefore, the Contractor is collecting an average of \$13,304.87 a month for the benefit of the Board. Our office works closely with any Subject who needs assistance. We send letters periodically as a reminder of unpaid fees, we arrange for payment plans to assist those who have financial hardship, and we supervise those payments. Filing an action in Circuit Court is only used

as a last resort.

Fines and costs are usually easier to collect from licensees because they have a vested interest in maintaining a current, active license status. Some licensees who have had their license suspended or revoked ignore the requirements to pay fines and costs. In those cases, we pursue collection efforts.

Collecting fines and costs is sometimes more difficult with unlicensed subjects. Many of these individuals knew they were breaking the law when committing the offenses and are less diligent about paying the fines and costs imposed by the Board. Of the remaining unlicensed cases with outstanding fines and costs, some subjects have moved and cannot be located, have filed for bankruptcy, have Final Judgments recorded against them in Circuit Court, or are related to interior design cases that are not being pursueddue to the federal ruling.

**Education** - The Contractor provided numerous presentations throughout the State of Florida for the purpose of educating professionals about the laws, rules and disciplinary process. The presentations served two major purposes: to educate architects and interior designers about wrongful conduct, the consequences, and how to avoid it; and how to recognize violations and file complaints with our office. As regulations change and new professionals join the industry, the need for these types of educational presentations will be ongoing.

#### X. <u>Updated Disaster Recovery Plan</u>

As required by the Contract, attached hereto as Exhibit "D" is an updated disaster recovery plan.

#### XI. Conclusion

This report, like others before it, indicates the Board is being well served under the privatization model. Since the Contractor has taken over the disciplinary functions for the Board from the Department, the Contractor has consistently maintained a high level of prosecutions, increased the number of complaints being filed and provided guidance and education to architects and interior designers. Florida citizens' health, safety and welfare continue to be protected from violations under the jurisdiction of the Board of Architecture and Interior Design.

Jonathan Brown Sublime Design Services, Inc. Case No. 2022-041490 2022-041494

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing 48 hours of continuing education and suspension until compliance against Drew Tucker's license to practice architecture. Mr. Tucker affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required hours and did not provide any hours of continuing education during the audit period.

#### **Gerald Victorian**

#### Case No. 2022-034559

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing 11 hours of continuing education against Gerald Victorian's license to practice architecture. Mr. Victorian affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required hours and only provided 19 hours of continuing education during the audit period.

#### **Disaster Recovery**

The following is the Contractor's disaster recovery and contingency plan for the records maintained to support the services to be provided under the contract. The plan takes into account disasters caused by weather, water, fire, environmental spills and accidents, malicious destruction, acts of terrorism, and contingencies such as strikes, epidemics, etc. The plan will ensure continuation of the contracted services as well as supporting records.

In any disaster the primary concern is going to be the safety of the Contractor's employees. The secondary concern in any disaster would be to save the files representing the pending cases before the Board. In the unlikely event the Contractor's paper files are destroyed and there is a need to recreate the files, most of the information is filed with either the clerk's office of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation or the Division of Administrative Hearings.

The Board's electronic data is contained on Dell enterprise level servers with sufficient backups and business class anti-virus protection. The servers are owned by the firm and are located onsite at the firm's place of business; this is an advantage for disaster planning, as opposed to cloud-based offsite data storage, because the firm's onsite server data can be accessed and managed without Internet service if ISP's are disabled in a disaster. The servers are located on the 4th floor of a 5-story commercial office building, which minimizes risk of water or flood damage. The server room is self-contained with no windows, located in the middle of a 10,000 square foot floor space, which minimizes the risk of wind damage. The building is continuously monitored by a third party for fire protection, and response times are generally 5-10 minutes. No sprinklers are located in or around the server room to minimize any risk of water damage due to fire alarms.

Although much of the information contained in the Contractor's paper files are saved on its network drive, there would be effort to save the actual files if there is sufficient notice of a pending disaster. Within three hours a majority of the files could be removed from the office and stored at an off-site location. If the primary threat is flooding, the Contractor would move the files to the Contractor's office space that is located on the fifth floor. If the primary threat is wind, the files would be secured at their current location, The Contractor currently owns a large storage unit that could also be utilized, or the files could be stored at the Project Manager's personal residence. At any location, the files would be placed in banker boxes and secured with plastic wrappings to protect them from water damage,

Fire is the most common of all business disasters. Each year fires cause thousands of deaths and injuries and billons of dollars in damage. Our current office is inspected for fire safety to ensure compliance with fire codes and regulations. The building is currently equipped with smoke alarms, detectors, and fire extinguishers in appropriate locations. Further, the fire department is automatically notified when the alarms are activated.

It is impossible to be prepared for all disasters; however, the Contractor has implemented sufficient procedures to remain operable if many of the events identified in the opening paragraph were to occur. It cannot be emphasized enough that under no circumstances would the safety of Contractor's employees or their families be jeopardized to save information or continue operations. However, with its state of the art computer system, it is believed that the Contractor would be up and running to satisfy the needs of the Board before most other businesses.
