Dear Governor Scott:

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) strongly supports the continued efforts of the citizen support organization, the Florida Missing Children's Day Foundation, and recommends the organization continue to support the annual Florida Missing Children's Day (FMCD) ceremony.

The second Monday in September of each year has been designated as "Florida Missing Children's Day" pursuant to Florida Statute 683.23. Each year parents, children, legislators, law enforcement officers and citizens convene at the Capitol Courtyard in Tallahassee to remember Florida's missing children, who are still missing and those who will never come home again. The Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and FDLE Commissioner are invited as speakers.

The FDLE Missing Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse (MEPIC) Advisory Board was created in 1996 to address issues dealing with Florida's missing children. The Advisory Board is a diverse mix of law enforcement officials, victim parents, government agencies, missing person non-profit organizations and members of the business community with interest in missing person issues. The Advisory Board has sub-committees that work on various missing child projects to include the events to support FMCD. FMCD is an annual event that is required pursuant to Florida Statute 683.23 to raise awareness regarding missing children and provide public awareness and education about child safety.

The Foundation was established by Florida Statute 683.231 in 2008, to provide assistance, funding and promotional support for programs developed by the FDLE MEPIC Advisory Board. The funding is used for the FMCD event, as well as providing safety information to school children, their parents and the public. These safety materials are related to preventing abductions and protecting children from exploitation. All sponsorship funds are used for FMCD and the promotion of the event.



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FMCD expenses include purchases of awards, invitations, printing and postage for nominations and essay contest materials, event coordinator, sound and stage equipment rentals, hotel and travel costs for award winners and victim family members and incidental costs related to hosting the event.

The Foundation maintains a website with information about FMCD and instructions on how to contribute funds for the annual event. In addition, the Foundation maintains an account to collect funds and pay expenses to support the event. This website for the Foundation (www.fdle.state.fl.us/MCICSearch/AdvisoryBoard.asp) is located within the FDLE public website under the Missing & Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse.

Since 2008, the Foundation has successfully raised funds to support the FMCD event. It is therefore recommended that the Florida Department of Law Enforcement receive direct support from the Foundation in order to raise funds to pay for expenses related to supporting the annual event, which has been commemorated since 1999.

We look forward to working with the Florida Missing Children Foundation and maintaining an ongoing partnership in efforts to keep our children and citizens safe.

Statutory Authority: 683.231 Citizen support organization for Florida Missing Children's Day.--

(1) The Department of Law Enforcement may establish a citizen support organization to provide assistance, funding, and promotional support for activities authorized for Florida Missing Children's Day under s. 683.23.

(2) As used in this section, the term "citizen support organization" means an organization that is:

(a) A Florida corporation not for profit incorporated under chapter 617 and approved by the Department of State.

(b) Organized and operated to conduct programs and activities; raise funds; request and receive grants, gifts, and bequests of money; acquire, receive, hold, invest, and administer, in its own name, securities, funds, objects of value, or other property, either real or personal; and make expenditures to or for the direct or indirect benefit of the department in furtherance of Florida Missing Children's Day.

(3) The citizen support organization is not a registered lobbyist within the meaning of s. 11.045.

(4) The citizen support organization is specifically authorized to collect and expend funds to be used for awards; public awareness and awards ceremonies, workshops, and other meetings, including distribution materials for public education and awareness; travel; Internet and web-hosting services; administrative costs, including personnel costs; costs of audits; and costs of facilities rental.

(5) The activities of the citizen support organization must be determined by the department to be consistent with the goals and mission of the department and in the best interests of the

state and approved in writing by the department to operate for the direct or indirect benefit of the department. The approval shall be given in a letter of agreement from the department.

(6)(a) The department may fix and collect charges for the rental of facilities and properties managed by the department and may permit, without charge, appropriate use of administrative services, property, and facilities of the department by the citizen support organization, subject to this section. The use must be directly in keeping with the approved purposes of the citizen support organization and may not be made at times or places that would unreasonably interfere with opportunities for the public to use such facilities for established purposes. Any money received from rentals of facilities and properties managed by the department may be held in the Operating Trust Fund of the department or in a separate depository account in the name of the citizen support organization and subject to the provisions of the letter of agreement with the department. The letter of agreement must provide that any funds held in the separate depository account in the name of the citizen support organization is no longer approved by the department to operate in the best interests of the state.

(b) The department may adopt rules with which a citizen support organization must comply in order to use department administrative services, property, or facilities.

(c) The department may not permit the use of any administrative services, property, or facilities of the state by a citizen support organization that does not provide equal membership and employment opportunities to all persons regardless of race, color, religion, gender, age, or national origin.

(7) The citizen support organization shall provide for an independent annual financial audit in accordance with s. 215.981. Copies of the audit shall be provided to the department, the Office of Policy and Budget in the Executive Office of the Governor, and the Florida Cabinet.

Section 112.3251, Florida Statutes was effective July 1, 2014 and requires every citizen support or directsupport organization created or authorized pursuant to law to adopt its own ethics code. The Florida Missing Children's Day Foundation, Inc. (FMCDF) is a citizen support organization created under the authority of Section 683.231, Florida Statutes.

It is the policy of the FMCDF that the Directors and Officers (Directors) hold their positions for the benefit of the public. They are bound to uphold the Constitution of the United States and the State Constitution and to perform efficiently and faithfully their duties under the laws of the federal, state, and local governments. 2) Accept any compensation, payment, or thing of value, on behalf of me or my spouse or minor child, when such Director knows, or, with the exercise of reasonable care, should know, that it was given to influence a vote or other action in which the Director was expected to participate in his or her official capacity.

3) Corruptly use or attempt to use my official position or any property or resource which may be within my trust, or perform my official duties, to secure a special privilege, benefit, or exemption for myself.

4) Disclose or use information not available to members of the general public and gained by reason my official position, except for information relating exclusively to governmental practices, for my personal gain or benefit or for the personal gain or benefit of any other person or business entity.

5) Vote on any matter that I know would inure to my special private gain or loss.

6) Failure to observe the Code of Ethics may result in the removal of that person from their position and/or may result in the Florida Department of Law Enforcement terminating its Agreement with the FMCDF.
