The Healthy Food Financing Initiative (HFFI) was established in 2016 to increase access to fresh produce and other nutritious food in underserved communities by providing financial assistance for the rehabilitation or expansion of independent grocery stores, supermarkets, community facilities, or other structures. The HFFI received an appropriation of \$500,000.00.

- Pursuant to Florida Statutes, Section 500.81(3)(b)(1), the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services elected to contract with a qualified, Florida-based federally certified community development financial institution to administer the HFFI through a public-private partnership. After a competitive bidding process, the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services selected the Florida Community Loan Fund to administer the HFFI. The contract for this agreement was executed on February 23, 2017.
- As of April 2020, the Florida Community Loan Fund has distributed the full appropriation amount of \$500,000.00 in HFFI funds for three total projects allowed by Florida Statutes, Section 500.81 and Chapter 5P-10, F.A.C.
- As of May 23, 2021, all three funded projects have been completed.
